Conscious Commitment for the Week:

"This week, I am willing to see **tattling**, not as an annoyance, but as a **call for help** and an opportunity to teach."





### 3 Types of Tattling

Identified by Conscious Discipline



The child says:
"She hit me"
"He pulled my hair"
"They called me stupid"

Someone has intruded on their space and their safety.

You say: "Did you like it?"

### 2. Revenge

The child says:

"She didn't wash her hands"
"He's trying to sneak a cookie"

"They said a bad word"

They are reporting the behavior of someone else to see what you will do.

You say: "Are you telling me to be helpful or hurtful?

### 3. Safety

The child says:

"He fell out of the tree"

"They are kicking each other"

"Someone is bleeding"

Someone is hurt or unsafe.

You say: "Thank you for letting me know. I'll take care of it."
